SUBJECT: Re-announcement of the Masters of Military Logistics Program

1. The memorandum re-announces the Masters of Military Logistics (MML) degree program at North Dakota State University (NDSU) and solicits nomination fro the class to commence 4 August 2008 and end 5 August 2009. The MML is open to applicants from all career fields and career programs with a target audience of DA civilians, GS 11-13/ Pay Band 2 and Military Officers, Captain to Major. The MML is centrally funded. A joint career field/ career program competitive selection board will be held in the spring of 2008. Upon completion of the Army Board process, prospective applicants will be notified of their application status and application packets will be forwarded to NDSU. Applications are due 17 April 2008.

2. The 36-credit hour MML is a professional degree program targeted specifically at career military officers and Department of the Army civilians. The degree is tailored to the DoD's strategic goals of joint officer development and logistics transformation. Because of its interdisciplinary and specialized nature, the MML degree will offer a unique curriculum with emphasis on joint military logistics and transportation.

a. MML program details, objectives and themes, courses, and core competencies are at enclosure 1. Application and selection procedures are at enclosure 2. Criteria for nomination and selection are at enclosure 3, and Army nomination packet requirements are at enclosure 4.

b. The applicant must meet two basic requirements: (1) must take or have taken the Graduate management Admission Test (GMAT) prior to the application deadline and (2) possess an undergraduate degree with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. GMAT scores are valid for 5 years.
